RE: **Ronda Jo Miller**- Gallaudet University Hall of Fame Induction

It is with great honor that I inform the North Star community regarding the induction of Ronda Jo Miller into Gallaudet University Hall of Fame. Ronda Jo Miller is currently North Star's Physical Education and Electives teacher. She is also a coach for North Star girls' volleyball and basketball teams.

Ronda Jo attended Gallaudet University this past weekend to attend the Hall of Fame induction ceremony for her excellence in basketball. She played for Gallaudet University from 1997-2000. Ronda Jo, whose 2,656 career points currently tops Gallaudet's all-time scoring list, also puts her in the third spot on the Division III all-time scoring list. Ronda Jo also set CAC (Capital Athletic Conference) marks for career rebounds (1,545) and field goals (1,090). Within the conference, she earned 1997 Rookie of the Year, and was named Player of the Year for three consecutive seasons (1997, 1998 and 1999). Miller also participated in two NCAA tournaments, with the 1997 trip going to the first round and the 1999 season seeing a Sweet 16 appearance. Ronda Jo also was the first deaf woman ever to break into the ranks of the WNBA. She played briefly with the Washington Mystics in the preseason of 2002.
